



Mitigating Human-wildlife conflict

Employing natural environmentally sustainable defences such as beehive and chili 'fences', and technology such as solar-powered strobe lights to deter elephants, reduce crop-damage and protect farmers by minimising encounters.

Tourism

Support community initiatives to identify and set up tour based small businesses to tap into and compliment wildlife tourism

Beekeeping

Donating beekeeper starter sets, honeybees to start colonies, training (for beehives building, beekeeping and the basics of running an owner-operator small business), supply scrap and repurposed materials for constructing hives, identify existing and potential markets and provide sales support.

Conservation farming

Collaborate with other organisations to facilitate food security through training in environmentally and economically sustainable farming practices. (Conservation farming protects soil from erosion and degradation; contributes to the preservation of water; enhances biodiversity in the agricultural production system; reduces costs and labour; optimises yield; and sequesters carbon, thereby contributing to climate change mitigation)

Association of artisans

Support the establishment of community cooperatives to facilitate income generation opportunities such as the domestic and international sale of legal goods

Guardian scheme

Support the establishment of place-based community coordinated taskforces to enable community policing of poaching activities
